Core Product Summary Sheet for Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Strategic Plan

Document Purpose

A 5-year Commuter Assistance Program (CAP) strategic plan is required by the Department of Rail and Public Transportation to receive CAP operation assistance funds. In addition, this plan guides the Transportation Demand Management strategies for the region to achieve sustainability goals.

The TDM Strategic Plan identifies service areas as a framework for implementing and managing TDM related projects such as:

Commuter Assistance Program: provide direct services to commuters, such as trip planning, vanpool services and employer outreach to implement commuter benefits programs

Non-Commute Options Marketing and Outreach: marketing campaigns and outreach initiatives that promote transportation options. Ex. "How to ride the Bus Video"

TDM Planning, Policy, Research, and Advancement: engage in strategic planning and policy development activities to integrate TDM into regional transportation Planning. Ex. Update the CMP TDM Safety, Access and Emerging Mobility: manage projects that directly support the provision of transportation infrastructure. Ex. Bus shelter installation, Bike Rack donation program Capacity Building: Equip regional partners with the knowledge, tools, and support to promote

sustainable transportation and build long term capacity for TDM programs. Ex. Participate as stakeholders of regional initiatives, like 'Live Well Alleghany"

Goals and Objectives

The overarching goal of RVARC-RIDE Solutions is to promote, plan, and encourage transportation options to reduce automobile trips, and maintain acceptable roadway congestion by increasing the use of other modes of transportation such as transit, rideshare (vanpool and carpool), bicycling, and walking by commuters and travelers in the RVARC Region.

Five goals were established in support of the overarching goal:

- Incorporate TDM into the transportation planning process at RVARC.
- Enhance coordination with the RIDE Solutions regional program partners.
- Increase the awareness of mobility options for residents, travelers, and workers in the region.
- Enhance the performance and safety of the region's transportation network.
- Provide education and outreach to residents, commuters, travelers, employers, and workers.

Rural Long Range Transportation Plan

Among the goals of the RLRTP are, reduce congestion along I-81, expand public transportation
and passenger rail, and provide a safe and secure transportation system to the rural
communities.

Hazard Mitigation Plan

- TDM strategies serve as a tool within the Hazard Mitigation plan to achieve resilience goals, including:
 - o Transportation planning for evacuation during emergencies
 - Develop a resiliency plan for extreme heat mitigation, specifically due to the heat island effect related to asphalt surfaces and parking surface lots.

Blueprint for Action

TDM strategies focused on education and access to transportation services support the
Blueprint priorities by facilitating education sessions for individuals and families transitioning
from addiction or reintegration from incarceration. Similarly, when focusing on Recovery, the
Blueprint seeks to improve accessibility to wrap-around services for which transportation access
is usually a priority.

Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy

 TDM supports the RVARC 2025-2029 CEDS goal to improve the multimodal transportation network by promoting, facilitating education and conducting planning studies in local and regional transit programs, including the Bus Stop Accessibility Study, Rural Microtransit studies, Art by Bus, and the Better Bus Stops for Neighborhoods project.
